



## **Rezan Has Museum opens a new exhibition to cover a 9 thousand-year-old daily life**

**Rezan Has Museum invites visitors to glance at the 9,000-year history of daily life that covers a timespan from 6,500 B.C.E to 1,300 C.E, with the exhibition "Archeology of Daily Life". The exhibition, which includes approximately 400 artifacts, will remain open until 31 May 2021 at Rezan Has Museum.**

The "Archeology of Daily Life" exhibition, will take visitors on an adventure by making them feel like 'spending a day in antiquity' with the artifacts from 9 thousand B.C.E to 13<sup>th</sup> century C.E. The exhibition opens a door to the ordinary days of the civilizations that formed Anatolia, left a mark in our culture and tradition, and made us who we are.

### **The impact of Anatolian geography on daily life.**

The "Archeology of Daily Life", which is a continuation of the "Heritage of the Earth" exhibition, also blinks at the "Whispers of Extinct Languages" exhibition as contains traces of Anatolian culture that has developed and changed throughout history through objects that shape our daily life. Despite the tumultuous life stories, adventures, and differences of Anatolian civilizations, they created a collective memory in this region. This is presented in a wide display of cups and wares used in antiquity for cooking, eating, drinking, serving wine and water, and preserving olive oil, as well as vessels left as gifts at tombs or as votive offerings for gods.

The exhibition, which includes approximately 400 works, will be open until 31 May 2021 at Rezan Has Museum.
